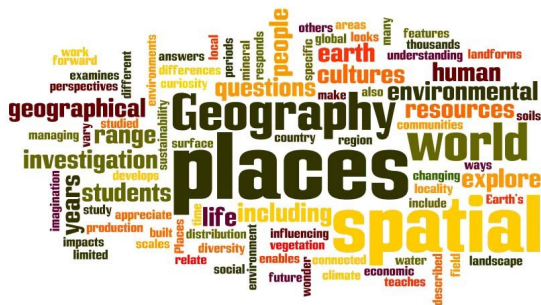
Where possible, learning will be supported and enriched by field study, visits, visitors, artefact boxes and role-play.

Progression of knowledge, skills and understanding is carefully planned, reviewed and adapted yearly to ensure that children's learning builds effectively over time.

Why is GEOGRAPHY an important part of our curriculum?

Learning Geography encourages self-awareness and responsibility towards the positive future of our world. It is important that children are taught to recognise their place in an ever growing world population. An awareness of the wider world can also fire the imagination and therefore encourage the desire to explore our planet. These experiences should ultimately encourage tolerance and respect for other people and cultures.

Certain skills, for example map reading, are a vital learning tool that can be called upon throughout their life. Learning about our local area, region, country, and the wider world (and how these have changed over time) gives our children knowledge and skills that can allow them to make a positive difference in the future.
